MUST BE OF AGE AT THESE APPOINTMENTS TO RECEIVE VACCINES

- ¹ HEP B: If not administered at birth, give initial dose at newborn visit; administer 2nd dose at 1 mo if mom is HEP B positive
- ² FLU: Give >6 mo September to June; if under 8 yo AND if there is only 1 previously documented dose, then will need two for current season
- ³ MENINGITIS: 11 yo dose, then booster at 16 yo; if 1st dose at 13-15 yo, then booster at 16-18 yo; if 1st dose age 16, no booster needed – see CDC recommended child/adolescent immunization schedule age 0-18 yo regarding pt with high-risk condition or immunocompromise
- ⁴ ROTATEQ: Maximum age to start series is 15 yo, maximum age to complete series is 8 yo
- ⁵ 2 MO: Earliest age for 2 mo vaccines is 6 wo; if given at 6 wo, you may give next series of vaccines 4 weeks later at 10 wo
- ⁶ MMR: Can receive at 6 mo for travel purposes, will still need 2-dose series after 12 mo
- ⁷ HEP A: ≥12 mo: 2 doses 6 mo apart, can be given at 6 mo for travel, will still need 2-dose series after 12 mo
- ⁸ TDAP: 11 yo visit, booster every 10 years, administer for puncture wound with metal if >5 years since last dose
- ⁹ GARDASIL: If first dose <15 yo, then give 2 doses 6 mo apart; if first dose >15 yo, then give 3 doses at 0, 2, and 6 mo – Gardasil may be started as early as 9 yo
- ¹⁰ BEXSERO: 2nd dose at least 6 mo apart
